


2014-2015 State Bar President-elect Candidates

The State Bar Board of Directors approved the nominations of **Allan K. DuBois** of San Antonio and **Beverly Bell Godbey** of Dallas as president-elect candidates at its meeting in San Antonio on Jan. 24. Texas lawyers will vote for the president-elect in April. The lawyer chosen will serve a one-year term as president-elect from June 2014 to June 2015, and then will serve as president of the State Bar of Texas from June 2015 to June 2016. The State Bar president-elect candidates are recommended by the board's Nominations and Elections Committee in accordance with a three-year rotating cycle between members in a metropolitan area, non-metropolitan area, and an open year (this year).
