Whereas Sarah Dingivan has been a licensed Texas attorney since May 2009 after earning her Doctor of Jurisprudence from Emory University School of Law,

Whereas Mrs. Dingivan served from 2010 to 2016 in the United States Air Force Judge Advocate General's Corps,

Whereas Mrs. Dingivan is managing attorney for the San Antonio Bar Association's Community Justice Program, which provides free legal services to indigent or at-risk individuals who may not otherwise have access to the legal system,

Whereas Although the Community Justice Program is not designed to be an emergency legal services provider, Mrs. Dingivan was instrumental in administering emergency response legal assistance when the program's clients desperately needed it,

Whereas Mrs. Dingivan went above and beyond her regular job duties to serve Community Justice Program clients in the wake of the back-to-back disasters of Hurricane Harvey and the tragic loss of life at First Baptist Church in Sutherland Springs,

Whereas Mrs. Dingivan was instrumental in curating legal resources and securing volunteer attorneys to assist Sutherland Springs victims with legal needs,

Whereas Mrs. Dingivan has been a reassuring lifeline for clients in need in the wake of these disasters,

Whereas Mrs. Dingivan gave selflessly of her time and skills to make sure those affected by the tragedies knew they were not alone and could receive the legal assistance they needed,

Be It Therefore Resolved that the State Bar of Texas honors Sarah Dingivan with this resolution for her commitment to the legal profession, her service to the country in the United States Air Force, her invaluable support of the San Antonio Bar Association and the Community Justice Program, and her dedication to the victims of Hurricane Harvey and the Sutherland Springs tragedy and to all people of the State of Texas.

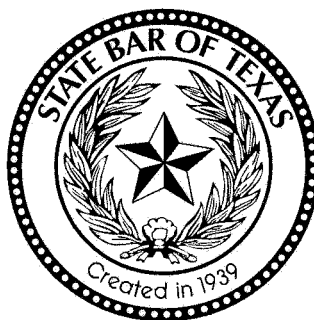

Whereas Mr. Caldwell is a Chief Warrant Officer and helicopter pilot in the United States Army Reserve and was deployed to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom in 2011-12,

Whereas Mr. Caldwell has been a key partner and resource to the San Antonio Bar Association and its Community Justice Program,

Whereas Mr. Caldwell has been vital in connecting families in need with the Community Justice Program,

Whereas Mr. Caldwell was instrumental in pulling the local legal community together to assist victims of the tragic loss of life at First Baptist Church in Sutherland Springs, Texas, in November 2017,
