JUDGMENT OF FULLY PROBATED SUSPENSION

Parties and Appearance

On March 1, 2018, came on to be heard the above-styled and numbered cause. Petitioner, Commission for Lawyer Discipline, appeared by and through its attorney of record and announced ready. Respondent, **RAYAN D. GANESH** (Respondent), Texas Bar Number **24068728**, appeared in person and announced ready.

Jurisdiction and Venue

The Evidentiary Panel 6-1, having been duly appointed to hear this complaint by the chair of the Grievance Committee for State Bar of Texas District 6, finds that it has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter of this action and that venue is proper.

Professional Misconduct

The Evidentiary Panel, having considered all of the pleadings, evidence, stipulations, and argument, finds Respondent has committed Professional Misconduct as defined by Rule 1.06(W) of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure.

Findings of Fact

The Evidentiary Panel, having considered the pleadings, evidence and argument of counsel, makes the following findings of fact and conclusions of law:

1. Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and is a member of the State Bar of Texas.
2. Respondent resides in and maintains his principal place of practice in Dallas County, Texas.
3. On June 3, 2016, Respondent approached Complainant Aspen Bre Ann Mitchell (Mitchell), who did not seek Respondent's advice regarding employment nor had a family or past or present attorney-client relationship, offering to represent Mitchell in the two misdemeanor cases in which she was waiting to appear in court that same day.
4. Thereafter, Respondent failed to keep Mitchell reasonably informed about the status of her cases, including not informing Mitchell of court dates in the matter.
5. Respondent failed to promptly comply with reasonable requests for information from Mitchell about her legal matter.
6. Respondent engaged in conduct that constitutes barratry as defined by the law of this state.
7. Respondent owes restitution in the amount of Six Hundred Dollars and No Cents (\$600.00) to Aspen Bre Ann Mitchell.
8. The Chief Disciplinary Counsel of the State Bar of Texas has incurred reasonable attorney's fees and direct expenses associated with this Disciplinary Proceeding in the amount of Two Thousand Eight Hundred Thirty-Six Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$2,836.50).
9. The Chief Disciplinary Counsel of the State Bar of Texas has incurred direct expenses associated with this Disciplinary Proceeding in the amount of Four Hundred Four Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$404.50).

Conclusions of Law

The Evidentiary Panel concludes that, based on foregoing findings of fact, the following Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct have been violated: Rules 1.03(a), 7.03(a) and 8.04(a)(9).

Sanction

The Evidentiary Panel, having found that Respondent has committed professional misconduct, heard and considered additional evidence regarding the appropriate sanction to be imposed against Respondent. After hearing all evidence and argument and after having considered the factors in Rule 2.18 of the Texas Rule of Disciplinary Procedure, the Evidentiary Panel finds that the proper discipline of the Respondent for each act of Professional Misconduct is a Probated Suspension.

Accordingly, it is **ORDERED, ADJUDGED** and **DECREED** that Respondent be suspended from the practice of law for a period of twelve (12) months, with the suspension being fully probated pursuant to the terms stated below. The period of probated suspension shall begin on March 1, 2018, and shall end on February 28, 2019.

Terms of Probation

It is further **ORDERED** that during all periods of suspension, Respondent shall be under the following terms and conditions:

1. Respondent shall not violate any term of this judgment.
2. Respondent shall not engage in professional misconduct as defined by Rule 1.06(W) of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure.
3. Respondent shall not violate any state or federal criminal statutes.
4. Respondent shall keep State Bar of Texas membership department notified of current mailing, residence and business addresses and telephone numbers.
5. In addition to complying with the Minimum Continuing Legal Education requirements of the State Bar of Texas, Respondent shall complete four (4) additional hours of Continuing Legal Education (CLE) in the area of Practice Management and Client Communications. These additional hours of CLE are to be completed online on or before April 2, 2018. Within ten (10) days of the completion of these additional CLE hours, Respondent shall verify completion of the course to the State Bar of

Texas, Chief Disciplinary Counsel's Office, P.O. Box 12487, Austin, TX 78711-2487 (1414 Colorado St., Austin, TX 78701).

6. In addition to complying with the Minimum Continuing Legal Education requirements of the State Bar of Texas, Respondent shall complete six (6) additional hours of CLE in the area of Legal Ethics. These additional hours of CLE are to be completed in person or live on or before August 1, 2018. Within ten (10) days of the completion of these additional CLE hours, Respondent shall verify completion of the course to the State Bar of Texas, Chief Disciplinary Counsel's Office, P.O. Box 12487, Austin, TX 78711-2487 (1414 Colorado St., Austin, TX 78701).
7. Respondent shall promptly respond to any request for information from the Chief Disciplinary Counsel in connection with any investigation of any allegations of professional misconduct.
8. Respondent shall pay restitution on or before March 12, 2018, to Aspen Bre Ann Mitchell, in the amount of Six Hundred Dollars and No Cents (\$600.00). Respondent shall pay the restitution by certified or cashier's check or money order made payable to Aspen Bre Ann Mitchell, and delivered to the State Bar of Texas, Chief Disciplinary Counsel's Office, P.O. Box 12487, Austin, TX 78711-2487 (1414 Colorado St., Austin, TX 78701).
9. Respondent shall pay all reasonable and necessary attorney's fees on or before April 2, 2018, to the State Bar of Texas in the amount of Two Thousand Eight Hundred Thirty-Six Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$2,836.50). The payment shall be made by certified or cashier's check or money order, made payable to the State Bar of Texas, and delivered to the State Bar of Texas, Chief Disciplinary Counsel's Office, P.O. Box 12487, Austin, TX 78711-2487 (1414 Colorado St., Austin, TX 78701).
10. Respondent shall pay all direct expenses on or before April 2, 2018, to the State Bar of Texas in the amount of Four Hundred Four Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$404.50). The payment shall be made by certified or cashier's check or money order, made payable to the State Bar of Texas, and delivered to the State Bar of Texas, Chief Disciplinary Counsel's Office, P.O. Box 12487, Austin, TX 78711-2487 (1414 Colorado St., Austin, TX 78701).
11. Respondent shall make contact with the Chief Disciplinary Counsel's Offices' Compliance Monitor at 877-953-5535, ext. 1334 and Special Programs Coordinator at 877-953-5535, ext. 1323, not later than seven (7) days after receipt of a copy of this judgment to coordinate Respondent's compliance.

Probation Revocation

Upon information that Respondent has violated a term of this judgment, the Chief Disciplinary Counsel may, in addition to all other remedies available, file a motion to revoke probation pursuant to Rule 2.23 of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure with the Board of Disciplinary Appeals (BODA) and serve a copy of the motion on Respondent pursuant to Tex.R.Civ.P. 21a.

BODA shall conduct an evidentiary hearing. At the hearing, BODA shall determine by a preponderance of the evidence whether Respondent has violated any term of this Judgment. If BODA finds grounds for revocation, BODA shall enter an order revoking probation and placing Respondent on active suspension from the date of such revocation order. Respondent shall not be given credit for any term of probation served prior to revocation.

It is further **ORDERED** that any conduct on the part of Respondent which serves as the basis for a motion to revoke probation may also be brought as independent grounds for discipline as allowed under the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct and Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure.

Restitution, Attorney's Fees and Expenses

It is further **ORDERED** Respondent shall pay restitution on or before March 12, 2018, to Aspen Bre Ann Mitchell, in the amount of Six Hundred Dollars and No Cents (\$600.00). Respondent shall pay the restitution by certified or cashier's check or money order made payable to Aspen Bre Ann Mitchell, and delivered to the State Bar of Texas, Chief Disciplinary Counsel's Office, P.O. Box 12487, Austin, TX 78711-2487 (1414 Colorado St., Austin, TX 78701).

It is further **ORDERED** Respondent shall pay all reasonable and necessary attorney's fees to the State Bar of Texas the amount of Two Thousand Eight Hundred Thirty-Six Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$2,836.50). The payment shall be made by certified or cashier's check or money order, made payable to the State Bar of Texas, and delivered to the State Bar of Texas, Chief Disciplinary Counsel's Office, P.O. Box 12487, Austin, TX 78711-2487 (1414 Colorado St., Austin, TX 78701).

It is further **ORDERED** Respondent shall pay direct expenses to the State Bar of Texas the amount of Four Hundred Four Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$404.50). The payment shall be made by certified or cashier's check or money order, made payable to the State Bar of Texas, and delivered to the State Bar of Texas, Chief Disciplinary Counsel's Office, P.O. Box 12487, Austin, TX 78711-2487 (1414 Colorado St., Austin, TX 78701).

It is further **ORDERED** that all amounts ordered herein are due to the misconduct of Respondent, are assessed as a part of the sanction in accordance with Rule 1.06(Z) of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. Any amount not paid shall accrue interest at the maximum legal rate per annum until paid and the State Bar of Texas shall have all writs and other post-judgment remedies against Respondent in order to collect all unpaid amounts.


This suspension shall be made a matter of record and appropriately published in accordance with the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure.
