



## In Memoriam: Joe R. Greenhill

Former Chief Justice **Joe R. Greenhill**, the longest-serving justice in the history of the Supreme Court of Texas, died on Feb. 11, 2011. He was 96. Greenhill was born in Houston in 1914, graduated from the University of Texas School of Law in 1939, and served in the U.S. Navy during World War II. Gov. Price Daniel appointed Greenhill to the Court in 1957. He succeeded Robert W. Calvert as chief justice in 1972.
