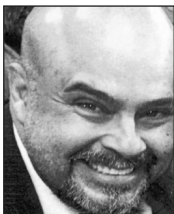
## EDWARD JOSEPH COFFEY



Coffey, 71, of Boerne, died December 22, 2018. He received his law degree from St. Mary's University School of Law and was admitted to the Texas

Bar in 1978. Coffey was an assistant district attorney in the Bexar County District Attorney's Office in San Antonio from February 1978 to May 2007, serving on the Drug Court, Drug Prosecution and Impact Program, and Child Abuse Unit & Civil Child Abuse/Neglect Section; and was coordinator of the Veterans Court Program. 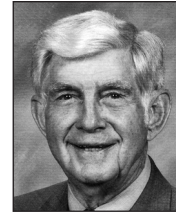
## CLYDE DANIEL JONES III
