Nitin Sud for District 4, Place 5

Nitin Sud's primary interests, if elected as a District Director, would be to work on issues relating to the state bar's budget and finances, address discrimination and bias in the profession, advocate for solos and small firms, and promote diversity.

Nitin is an employment attorney. He is certified by the Texas Board of Legal Specialization in labor and employment law. Nitin obtained his undergraduate degree from Duke University and his law degree from the University of Houston Law Center in May 2005. He practices almost exclusively in labor and employment law. His current solo practice, started in May 2013, primarily consists of representing employees in disputes involving discrimination, retaliation, harassment, overtime, employment contracts, and other employment matters. He previously worked at Fulbright & Jaworski LLP and Littler Mendelson P.C. He is a member of the National Employment Lawyers Association, Texas Employment Lawyers Association, and previously served as a council member of the Labor and Employment Section of the Houston Bar Association. He was selected as a Super Lawyer's Texas Rising Star from 2013 – 2017 and a Super Lawyer from 2017 – 2020. Nitin lives in Bellaire with his wife Rachel, a nurse at MD Anderson Cancer Center, and two daughters.
